



# Social Justice Studies: Women, Gender and LGBTQ Studies AA-T Degree - IGETC GE Breadth

The AA-T in Social Justice Studies: Women, Gender, and LGBTQ Studies provides a path for students wishing to transfer into various CSU majors related to Women, Gender, and LGBTQ Studies, such as Women's Studies, Gender Studies, or Queer Studies. This AA-T curriculum is an "Area of Emphasis" (AOE), which allows students to transfer into more than one CSU major related to Women, Gender, and LGBTQ Studies. Studies interested in transferring to a CSU campus to pursue a bachelor's degree in an AOE should meet with a counselor to confirm the courses required for lower division preparation in the major. This degree exposes students to the core principles and practices of the Social Justice Studies field to build a foundation for their future personal, academic, activist, or vocational paths.
