This CRC program is designed for students who want to gain certification as a wildland firefighter through the National Wildland Coordinating Group (NWCG). This program will provide training in hand crew formation, fireline construction, and using wildland fire equipment to be certified and gain entry into the wildland firefighting workforce. This program includes arduous physical conditioning, including hiking with up to 45 pounds of weight and other strenuous outdoor activities.
