### AA/AS Requirements

Associate Degrees require the following:

- 1. Completion of a minimum of 60 degree-applicable units with an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average). A minimum of 12 units must be completed at Sacramento City College.
- 2. Completion of each required course with a grade of "C" or better for a major offered at Sacramento City College.
- 3. Completion of <u>Sacramento City Colleg</u> <u>e's general education requirements</u> – Area I; Area II(a) and II(b); Area III(a) and III(b), or Area III(c); Area IV; Area V; and Area VI – with an overall 2.0 GPA.
- 4. Completion of all three <u>competency re</u> <u>quirements</u> (reading, writing, and mathematics).

\*\*If you don't place directly in STAT 300 (check your e-Services account), you will need to take STAT 10/PSYC 330 or STAT 10/STAT 300 combo course. STAT 10/PSYC 330 combo course is only offered during the Spring term. PSYC 330 is the recommended statistics course for students transferring to CSU Sacramento (see additional information under Department Faculty Notes).
