Transfer degrees require the following:

1. Complete all required courses for a major with a grade of "C" or better.
2. Complete 60 CSU-transferable units. At least 12 of the 60 units must be earned at Sacramento City College.
3. Complete one of the following general education (GE) patterns. Meet with your SCC Counselor to discuss the appropriate GE pattern for your individual transfer/graduation goals:

- **CSU General Education Breadth Requirements**
- **Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) – CSU option**
