CAREER PATH

Career Options:

Students completing this certificate are eligible to be a Director in a privately-funded early childhood program and a Site Supervisor in a publicly-funded early childhood program. Some school districts and Head Start programs require a Bachelor's degree.

Students completing this certificate will meet the education requirements for the Site Supervisor Permit, issued by the California Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC). However, the CTC also requires 350 days of 3+ hours per day of experience in an Early Childhood Education classroom/program within 4 years, including at least 100 days of supervising adults.

Advising Notes:

- 16 units of general education courses must include at least one course from each of the following four areas: Natural Science or Mathematical Concepts & Quantitative Reasoning, English Composition or Oral Communication & Critical Thinking, Arts & Humanities, and Social & Behavioral Sciences. A course cannot be used in the 16 units if already used in the 37 units of ECE core.
- ECE 320 and 321 both have a lab and a lecture component. Each course requires students to complete 108 hours in an approved early education classroom. Students taking these courses will have the option of completing their practicum experience at the ARC Child Development Center (CDC), at their
