¹This is a broad degree with many areas of interest, and this is just one possible path for completing the degree. There are many elective options available and students are encouraged to substitute elective courses where applicable. For students with a specific interest, some suggested electives are:

- illustration focus: ARTNM 324, 325, 326, 370, 372, and 373
- animation focus: ARTNM 373, 405, 420, 421, 422, 423, 429, and 431
- graphic design focus: ARTNM 303, 324, 328, 352, 354, 358, and 359

- ARTNM 326, 370, 422, and 450 are offered in the spring.
- ARTNM 421 is offered in the fall of even-numbered years.
- ARTNM 423 is offered in the fall of odd-numbered years.
- ARTNM 429 is offered in the spring of even-numbered years.
- ARTNM 431 is offered in the spring of odd-numbered years.
- ARTNM 358 and 359 are offered occasionally. Check the course schedule for their availability.

EXPLANATION OF CATEGORIES

Req	Required Core	A course that is required for this program
RE	Restricted Elective	A course selected from a list of elective courses specified for this program in the course list in the catalog, which can be replaced with another course from the same list
GE	General Education	A course that fulfills a specific general education requirement for a degree, which can be replaced with another course that meets the same requirement
Elec	Degree Elective	A degree-applicable course that is part of a degree roadmap to ensure that there is a total of at least 60 units, which is a requirement for an associate degree
