Career Options:

This degree prepares students for licensure as a Respiratory Care Practitioner in the state of California, at the Advanced Registered Respiratory Therapist level.

Career opportunities include positions in hospitals, physician's offices, home health care services, and medical supply companies.

Advising Notes:

- Students can substitute ESLW 340 for ENGL C1000/C1000H (formerly known as ENGWR 300/480).
- This degree can be completed using either the <u>local AA/AS</u> general education (GE) pattern or the <u>Cal-G</u> <u>ETC</u> transfer GE pattern. <u>See a coun</u> <u>selor</u> to determine which pattern is best for you based on your academic goals.
- It is highly recommended that students complete all of their general education coursework prior to enrolling in the program.
