Semester Sequence: Students are strongly encouraged to enroll in ECE 300 (Introduction to ECE) and ECE 312 (Child Development) during their first semester. ECE 312 serves as a prerequisite for ECE 326 (ECE Field Experience), while both ECE 300 and ECE 312 are required before taking ECE 320 (Curriculum and Interactions in ECE). Additionally, ECE 320 must be taken concurrently with ECE 326 as a co-requisite.

Career Options/Outlook:

Preschool Teachers instruct preschool-aged children in activities designed to promote social, physical, and intellectual growth needed for primary school in preschool, daycare centers, or other child development facilities.

The Early Childhood Education (ECE) Associate of Arts (A.A.) degree prepares graduates for careers in early learning and child development, meeting the growing demand for qualified educators.

Students aiming to teach Preschool through 3rd grade in public elementary schools can use this degree as a pathway to the PK-3 Early Childhood Education (ECE) Specialist Teaching Credential, as it includes required ECE coursework.

Enrollment in ECE 320 and ECE 321 provides up to 200 field experience hours, contributing toward the 600 hours needed for the preschool portion of the PK-3 ECE Specialist Credential and fulfilling 50 days in the California Child Development Permit Matrix.

Transfer notes:

Honors option:

Students who complete 15 units or more in honors-designated courses will earn special recognition as an Honors Scholar, a distinction that may entitle the student to guaranteed transfer and scholarship opportunities at select transfer colleges and universities.
