Career

Options/Outlook:

Political Science majors study the origin, development, and operation of political systems. May study topics such as public opinion, political decision-making, and ideology. May analyze the structure and operation of governments and various political entities. May conduct opinion surveys, analyze election results or analyze public documents. **Career opportunities require more than two years of college study.**

International Relations majors study world politics. Students analyze behaviors and interactions between countries and international organizations, considering national and global contexts and perspectives. Undergraduate international relations coursework includes political science, globalization, world history, economics, social research methods, and topics like capitalism and democracy. International Relations considers the social and cultural aspects of nations when examining global issues. **Career opportunities require more than two years of college study.**
