## **AA/AS** Requirements

Associate Degrees require the following:

- Completion of a minimum of 60 degree-applicable units with an overall grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 ("C" average). A minimum of 12 units must be completed within the Los Rios Community College District.
- 2. Completion of each required course with a grade of "C" or better for a major offered at Sacramento City College.
- Completion of the <u>California General E</u> <u>ducation Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GE</u> <u>TC)</u>. Areas 1 through 6 must be completed with a grade of "C" or better.

Students with Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate Credit (IB) test scores should notify their Counselor to learn more about how test scores may be used for credit.
