CAREER PATH

Career Options:

This degree prepares students to take the National and State Board examination to become a licensed funeral director in California. It also prepares students to take the National and State embalmer's examination.

Advising Notes:

- Students in majors (like this one) with 45 units or more of required coursework are exempt from the Area L7 general education requirement, so it is not included in this map. If you change your major you may be required to complete the L7 requirement.

Other Notes:

- This sequence works well for students who already have a degree or who have completed a considerable amount of college coursework.
- To enroll in this program, students must have a cumulative college GPA of 2.0 and a grade of "C" or better in the following courses: ACCT 101, BIOL 304, BUS 340, ENGL C1000/C1000H, FSE 300, BUS 105 or MATH 300, PSYC 390, and COMM C1000 or 331.
